Among the foremost violinists of her generation, Sherry Kloss has performed to great acclaim throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, and Australia. Her "singing style" reflects the influence of her close association as pupil and master-teaching assistant to Jascha Heifetz. Her recordings, "Forgotten Gems" and "Lost & Found Treasures of the Heifetz Legacy", have received international recognition with extensive interviews on NPR's "Weekend Edition", Performance Today", and WFMT Chicago "The Studs Terkel Almanac". She holds the prestigious Honorary Degree of Excellence from Siena, Italy's Academia Chigiana Musicale and serves as adjudicator for International competitions. In 1998, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania issued a proclamation recognizing Sherry Kloss as a prominent Pittsburgh artist. She is the Founder and Artistic Director of the Jascha Heifetz Music Institute for the Development of Personal Style at Southern Oregon University, author of the recently released book, "Jascha Heifetz Through My Eyes", and Co-Founder of "Jascha Heifetz Society". Miss Kloss held Professorships in South Australia, Southern California, and Indiana. In 2005, She was Soloist with St. Petersburg Philharmonic and conducted Master Classes at St. Petersburg Conservatory where Jascha Heifetz was a student with Leopold Auer.
